What does an Entomologist do?

- Study insects in their natural habitats, assessing effects of environment and industry

- Inventory or estimate insect populations.
- Study characteristics of insects such as relationships, classification, life histories, development and genetics.
- Study and examine insects left behind at a crime scene to help forensic investigators gather more information about the time a particular incident occurred.
