What does a Forestry Technician do?

- Tran and lead forest and conservation workers in various activities
- Plant tree seedlings and cultivate the land
- Map forest tract data such as access roads and areas such as burns
- Provide information about environmental protection
- Help put out and prevent forest fires
- Inspect trees and other wildlife and collect samples to check for damage
- Help with the planning and supervising of construction
- Patrol the park and forest area
- Work with digital mapping systems
