Job Description: Educate the public about environmental issues and nature by working with schools, nature reserves, nonprofits, and your local community.

- What does an Environmental Educator do?
 - Guide field trips for schools and other groups
 - Create and promote public programs on the environment
 - Give talks to schools and community groups about environmental issues and nature
 - Analyze and interpret data from different sources
 - Create resource materials like lectures or videos for public and personal use, other educators, and other stakeholders
 - Help develop programs in your community
 - Prepare grant proposals
 - Mentor other educators or team members
 - Participate in fundraisers or other activities

- Do you like working with students or other people?
- Are you interested in educating others on the environment?
- Are you interested in leading programs?

Outlook:

Salary- Salaries range from \$34,000-\$92,000 a year depending on your experience and location

Education/Program of Study:
