Job Description: Work in forests as part of a team to obtain raw material needed for goods and other products

What does a Logger do?

- Be part of a crew that cuts down trees and performs other tasks
- Separate logs by their different species and types of wood
- Inspect equipment to make sure it's safe for use
- Operate machinery that transports logs to a landing area
- Drive and operate machinery that cuts logs into a specific length
- Inspect logs for defects
- Monitor equipment to make sure everything is working properly
- Record data about individual trees
- Mark trees that are considered unsafe
- Assess a tree to determine which way the tree should fall to cause the least damage
