Job Description: Collaborate with field and biology staff to oversee the implementation of environmental restoration projects. Restoration Planners use scientific data and studies to strategize for restoration, monitoring, or management.

What does an Environmental Restoration Planner do?

- Develop environmental restoration project schedules and budgets
- Conduct site assessments to evaluate environmental damage and restoration needs
- Create habitat management or restoration plans
- Collect and analyze data from the environment
- Develop environmental restoration projects for sites with natural gas pipelines, power transmission lines, wind farms, etc.
- Write grants to obtain funding for projects
- Create environmental models through digital software, based on data
- Conduct impact studies on the effects of pollution, human activity, and climate change on the environment
