- Record patients' vital signs, administer medications, and monitor patients for reactions and side effects
- Monitor, record, and report symptoms or changes in patients' conditions
- May administer techniques for neonatal resuscitation
- Administer treatment through technologies including incubators and mechanical ventilation
- Conduct neonatal tests including hearing and vision tests
- Care for patient and mother needs by washing and administering shots to newborn, as well as educating parents on the newborn's needs
